DUTIES:

Reporting to the Manager of Engineering Analysis, the Mineral Development Engineer (Environmental) will assist in the planning and implementation of mineral development policy and regulations governing the establishment, operation, and termination of mining operations in the province. This position provides direction, guidance and advice on matters related to environmental and engineering issues and corresponding compliance with the Mining Act. As Mineral Development Engineer (Environmental) you will be responsible for performing professional engineering work in support of eliminating or mitigating environmental liabilities to the province from mining operations. You will provide engineering analysis and environmental review of development plans, rehabilitation and closure plans, financial assurance proposals, annual operating plans and annual reports submitted by mining lessees. You will conduct the engineering review and analysis of submitted mill license applications and perform project site inspections on new and existing mining operations and orphaned and abandoned mine (OAM) sites. You will commission reports as necessary, and exercise considerable judgment with respect to proposed projects. This position provides project management services on consulting and capital works projects as well as multi-faceted technical expertise on OAM sites.

3. Undergraduate degree in engineering - environmental, mining, civil, metallurgical (equivalencies will be considered)
