DUTIES: The primary assignment of the successful candidate will be to instruct students, facilitate learning and evaluate student progress in the College's Information Technology programs. The instructor will incorporate their own teaching style to existing lesson plans while meeting the learning objectives of the course material; work with other faculty members to maintain a coordinated and consistent teaching approach to ensure the planned curriculum for each course is delivered; prepare and implement various instructional strategies, techniques, and learning models using an approved curriculum to achieve specified learning outcomes; establish student performance objectives and evaluation methods; meet with students regularly to gauge and evaluate progress; communicate effectively at a level appropriate to the ability of students and support an emotionally safe learning environment that is conducive to learning; maintain appropriate classroom discipline following College policies and procedures; identify and resolve problem areas in teaching and learning; provide academic advising to students; participate in professional development activities to remain current in your field and post-secondary education profession; and actively participate in and contribute to accreditation activities to ensure the program is of the highest standard. The instructor will plan, organize, and manage learning activities and resources in both classroom and laboratory environments combining theoretical and practical learning experiences in a team-oriented setting encompassing front-line computer systems, back-end server environments and the local and wide-area network infrastructure. Instruction will focus on the skills, competencies and attitudes required to research, design, install and maintain computer systems and network infrastructure in a highly available and secure computing environment. The instructor will also perform other related duties consistent with maintaining quality learner-centered instruction.

QUALIFICATIONS: The successful candidate must possess knowledge and experience in IT infrastructure administration and support. Knowledge of current teaching/learning methods and classroom management is also required. Well-developed communication, analytical, conflict resolution, and organizational skills, as well as the ability to work independently and as part of a collaborative team while establishing and maintaining effective working relationships in a teaching environment are essential. Candidates must have a strong commitment to student success strategies and initiatives. The required knowledge and skills would normally have been acquired through the completion of a Bachelor Degree in Information Technology or equivalent

with specialization in the subject area and at least 4 years' recent, relevant professional work experience. Alternatively, a Diploma in Computer Systems and Networking or equivalent from an accredited institution with relevant industry certification in the area of instruction and at least 4 years' recent, relevant, industry experience may be considered. A Bachelor of Education (Secondary/Post-Secondary) Degree, eligibility for membership in an appropriate professional association, and teaching experience at the post-secondary level are considered assets.

SALARY: Commensurate with qualifications and experience in accordance with the College of the North Atlantic Faculty Collective Agreement.
